3. Circle K Club: This branch of Kiwanis recruits students in college. To connect with a nearby Circle K club, click on this [link](#).

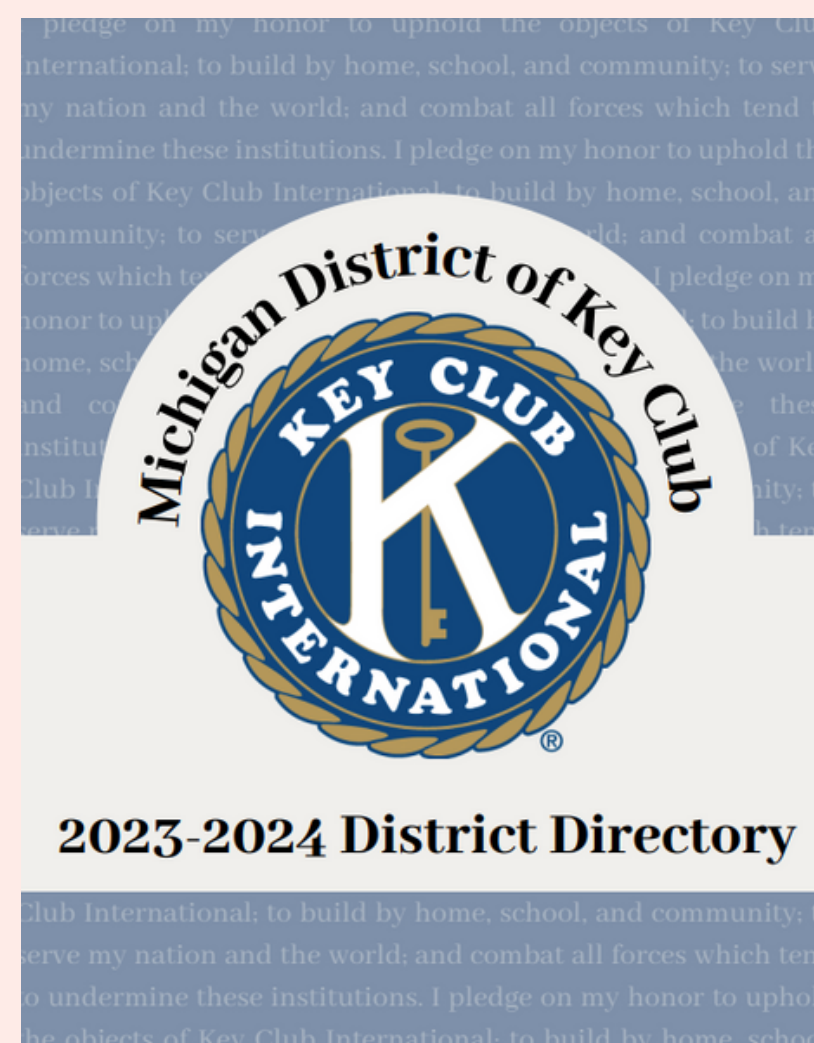
