TRFs are mandatory for all clubs. If your club has not turned in your August <u>TRF</u>I highly suggest you turn that in.







Youth Opportunity Fund

The Youth Opportunities Fund (YOF) grant is available for Key Clubs in good standing to apply for support with a service project. A Key Club in good standing means that the club's yearly dues must be paid before you can qualify to receive a grant from the Kiwanis Children's Fund. The service project that you use the YOF funds for must meet certain requirements in order to qualify, which you can learn more about here.

Applications for the first funding cycle will be due on October 15th of this year, and Key Club International will decide which clubs receive grants a month later. The final report will be due by December 31st, 2024. For more information




Erika's Lighthouse **GVTSP** Week
